### General anesthesia: Side effects, risks, and stages

The Surgical Risk Score assigns a numerical value to reflect the risk level associated with the procedure ranging from 1 (very low risk) to 5 (very high risk). These categories identify operations with increased potential for substantial blood loss or other intraoperative and postoperative risks.

### Important Complications of Anaesthesia. Information | Patient

In select cases wherein a patient is deemed to be at very high risk, consideration might be given to canceling the planned surgery and opting for alternative nonoperative or less-invasive treatments. Importantly, perioperative risk is influenced by both patient-level (e.g., age and comorbidity) and surgery-level risk factors.

However, within this population is hidden a subgroup of high-risk patients: in the UK 12.5% of patients account for 80% of perioperative deaths. The short-term postoperative mortality for this high-risk group is estimated at ~6% for elective patients and close to 30% for those having urgent or emergency surgery.

high-risk surgery: Any operation associated with a 5% or greater likelihood of adverse cardiovascular events. Examples include operations on peripheral arteries, the aorta, or the heart; surgeries that last more than 2 hours; and emergency surgeries, esp. when they are needed by patients with multiple illnesses or age over 75. A high-risk surgical procedure can be considered as one in which there is an accepted postoperative mortality rate of more than 1%. This includes cardiothoracic surgery, vascular surgery and major intra-abdominal cancer surgery, either as elective or emergency procedures.

Although general anaesthesia is not without risk, it should be remembered that it allows necessary procedures to be performed in a humane way - without which the patient might otherwise die. Along these lines, if a patient is high-risk for a general anaesthetic (eg, pre-existing comorbidities) then they should still be referred for surgery like any other patient.

A surgery that requires stopping the heart will have a higher risk than a surgery to remove tonsils, but both can still result in death. Trauma surgery, an emergency surgery to save the life of an injured patient who will die without an intervention, is an example of a very high-risk surgery.
