The Descriptive Phenomenological Method provides the lived-context of the participant and does so focusing on his or her perspective without the use of deception (Giorgi, 2009). Further, the method allows the researcher to keep the “voice” of the participants in the research without abstracting their viewpoint out through analysis.
