The Ottoman Empire lasted from 1299 to 1922. With Constantinople (Istanbul) as its capital city, in many respects it was an Islamic successor to the Eastern Roman (Byzantine) Empire. The Ottoman Empire in theory tolerated Christians and Jews. Mehmed II allowed the local Christians to stay in Constantinople after conquering the city in 1453, and in 1461 Sultan Mehmed II established the Armenian Patriarchate of Constantinople.
