The regulation states that "Ino other evidence of a postmark or of mailing will be prima facie evidence of delivery or raise a presumption that the document was delivered," thus abolishing the common law mailbox rule. Whether this 2011 regulation is valid was tested recently in Baldwin,921 F.3d 836 (9th Cir. 2019).

South Africa has a 'hybrid' or 'mixed' legal system, formed by the interweaving of a number of distinct legal traditions: a civil law system inherited from the Dutch, a common law system inherited from the British, and a customary law system inherited from indigenous Africans (often termed African Customary Law, of which there are many variations depending on the tribal origin).

EU legislation is divided into primary and secondary. The treaties (primary legislation) are the basis or ground rules for all EU action. Secondary legislation – which includes regulations, directives and decisions – are derived from the principles and objectives set out in the treaties.
