His ideas remain widely taught in military schools, and are, more than ever, essential to the modern strategist.

Modern theorists such as John Keegan, have discredited the Clausewitz theories of war as invalid and having minor to no value in today’s study of modern warfare when attempts are made to apply them to prevalent groups such as Al Qaeda.1 It is argued that the primary focus is on the Westphalia model of states and as a result Clausewitz’s writings cannot be applied to insurgencies nor can they be applied to identities other than nation-states who wage war.
