How to measure and record vital signs to ensure detection ...

Carry out the observation in pairs - either at the same time or a few hours or days apart. Don't talk about your findings until you have both finished. Observe at different times of the day and night, eg, early morning, late evening, lunch or supper time. Keep your observations relatively short, eg, 20-30 minutes.
