For explanation purposes, the secondary source is the work that uses the quote that you wish to include in your paper – this is also referred to as an indirect quote. Whenever you endeavor to call upon only a portion of the writing from the secondary source, it is best to utilize the most relevant segment that creates a strong comment about the quote being used indirectly.

How to self-cite in APA format: Again, from Walden University, we have a model. This models the citation in APA format: "If you cite or quote your previous work, treat yourself as the author and your own previous course work as an unpublished paper, as shown in the APA publication manual.

Citing yourself in very rare cases you might need to quote a short section (no more than 2 sentences) of an assignment you have previously submitted. If this is the case you should treat the quotation as you would any other source and correctly cite this in a footnote as below.

You should quote material when you believe the way the original author expresses an idea is the most effective means of communicating the point you want to make. If you want to borrow an idea from an author, but do not need his or her exact words, you should try paraphrasing instead of quoting.

Cite your previous essays as an unpublished work if you are using the MLA format. This falls under the "Dissertations and Master's Theses" citation section. Use this format: Your last name, Your first name. "Title of the Essay." Type of essay (for example, MA thesis). Name of the institution, date degree earned or year paper written.

When citing a paraphrase or summary from an eBook, the citation should include the author last name and date of publication.. When quoting an eBook without page numbers, your in-text citation needs to include the author's last name, year, and the most direct location of the quote, such as a chapter or section title and the paragraph number.. For example:

Can I cite myself or my degree in my paper? —Foggy in Fresno. Dear Foggy, Unfortunately, personal experience is not something you can cite in an academic paper. First, let's think about this question in terms of the purpose of the reference list, which is retrievability of the source for the reader.

If you need to make the same assumption in a new paper, then you should be able to cite the earlier work without needing to repeat all of the details. You need to avoid confusion . If you have similar previous work, and a reader might be legitimately confused about how the novelty in the new paper, then you should cite and clarify the differences.

Formatting the Paper. Type your paper if you hand-wrote it initially. Double-space the text, put 1-inch margins on all four sides of the text and make the font 10 to 12 points in Times New Roman or a similar, standard font. Insert a page header at the top left corner of each page. The header is the title of your paper.
